Hourly employees and student workers should always record all actual hours worked. There are 168 hours in this current pay period, including 24 hours of HOL pay for December 25th, January 1st and January 15th, as well as 8 hours of ADM pay for December 26th.

Please join us for our final two weeks of our panel discussion on Religious Diversity of the West this Thursday and next (Jan. 18 and 25).

Hosted by Carrie Gray-Wood, and featuring Dr. Tim Steckline, Dr. Nicholas Wallerstein, Professor Jace DeCory, Dr. Parthasarathi Nag, and Ms. Naveen Malik.

This panel is a series on local faculty/staff/student perspectives about their own religious paths. The panel is designed to showcase the religious diversity found on the BHSU campus, emphasizing non-Christian minority beliefs and the personal variations in each presenter's perspectives. The overall goals are to allow the audience to become familiar with some of the more common tenets of each organized religion presented, and common linkages between the ethics and belief systems of each, while still emphasizing the idea that each presenter brings their own personal interpretation of their religion.
