Distinguished Faculty Nominations Requested

The Faculty Senate seeks nominations for the annual Distinguished Faculty Award.

The purpose of this award is to encourage and reward outstanding professional dedication by faculty members of Black Hills State University. Nominees should show continued excellence in teaching; active research, scholarship, and other creative endeavors; their ongoing contributions to the community and society; and their continued exceptional service to students. One award shall be given each school year when there is a qualified nominee. Previous winners of the award are

not eligible.

The nomination process will be conducted in a manner so that the award is a complete surprise to all nominees and the eventual Distinguished Faculty Award winner.

Eligibility

The nominee shall be a faculty member whose primary assignment is teaching, and shall have taught a minimum of 36 hours during the past three years. Department chairs are eligible for the award if the above requirement is met in the school year when nominated.

Nominations should be made to the Faculty Senate Vice-President, Jeff Wehrung (<u>Jeffrey.Wehrung@BHSU.edu</u>), by Tuesday February 6, 2018. The nomination letter/email should outline the reasons why the nominated person is deserving of the award.

The letter/email should also indicate the intent to acquire the required letters of support and the nominee's Vita before Friday, February 16, 2018.

# BHSU announces South Dakota Stock Market Game top teams for fall trading session

The 2017 fall session of the South Dakota Stock Market Game (SDSMG) hosted by

Black Hills State University concluded with students at Mellette Middle School, Rapid City Stevens High School, and BHSU taking top honors. During this session, 362 students from 20 South Dakota schools formed 160 teams of stock market investors. Each team received a hypothetical \$100,000 to perform online investing in real-time stocks, bonds, and mutual funds.

BHSU mass communication major Micalyn Parry, from Chino, Ariz., won the college division with a final portfolio value of \$115,833. This was the highest portfolio in South Dakota., with a return on investment of 15.8 percent in ten weeks. Parry participated in the program as part of her survey of business course.
