We are currently seeking applications for instructors. Deadline: Rolling (please submit ASAP) Responsibilities and Application information are listed below. The International office can also send you the full handbook to learn more about the program. (Will be posted online when the website is fully up and running).

Faculty Selection

Two distinct types of positions are available: Program Faculty and Administrators. The Program Advisory Group will make recommendation to the Vice President for Enrollment and Student Affairs on faculty/administrator selections. The Vice President for Enrollment and Student Affairs will make the final decision. While there are two separate types of position, each will work seamlessly together and help in all areas where needed.

Criteria for Faculty Selection

Commitment to helping students have an international experience with service learning as a main focus along with providing students with academic credit.

Willingness to be responsible for students on a 24-hour basis while in a foreign country.

Commitment to enhancing students overall college experience.

Willingness to help students develop skills to work in a global society.

Willingness to develop and offer students experiences that will academic yield academic credit.

The ability to secure a letter of permission to participate in the program from one's dean or department chair.

Application Process for Faculty

Faculty will have an opportunity to apply for the program yearly, as determined by the PAG. The proposal application should be signed by the departmental chair and relevant dean.

Faculty should take care to understand the purpose and outcomes associated with the ISLP program before applying.
