Geek Speak! Uranium Mining in the Black Hills

Join us on Thursday at 4:00 p.m.in Jonas 110 for this week's Geek Speak: "Uranium Mining in the Black Hills: An Explosion of Public Interest," hosted by Lilias Jones Jarding, Ph.D., Clean Water Alliance. Uranium mining provides the raw material for nuclear weapons, nuclear power, and nuclear medicine. Uranium exploration, mining, and milling have taken place in the Black Hills from the 1950s to the present. Historically, these efforts focused on the southern Black Hills, but more recently the northern Hills have also become a mining site. Where there is uranium mining, there is water contamination and substantial water use, so this issue has been the subject of long-term controversy in our semi-arid region. Here, as in other locations, uranium mining has brought both economic boom and economic bust. Major modern issues include the current exploration boom, new and proposed mines, and the hundreds of unreclaimed mines and prospects in western South Dakota. Many people in our region - and particularly in the northern Black Hills -- aren't aware of the history, the current situation, or both. This presentation is designed to bring people up to speed, so they can be part of the discussion surrounding uranium mining in the Black Hills.



Spring D2L Courses

Attention faculty using D2L for Spring 2017 courses: Spring courses have been loaded into D2L. Please let Anne know as soon as possible if you would like multiple sections of your Spring courses into one course in D2L.

The term used by D2L is "mapping" them together. As an example, a request could include courses such as: SPED 431 B601 & B603 being mapped as SPED 431 B601 B603, SPED 431/531 B601 & B603 being mapped as SPED 431 531 B601 B603, ENGL 101 B001 & B002 & B003 being mapped as ENGL 101 B001 B002 B003.

Also, if you have cross-listed courses to be mapped together, please let us know. Mapping will begin on September 14 and we have until 3:00pm September 26 to complete it. Once mapped, the courses will be available to you for editing early the next day. Therefore, the sooner they are mapped, the quicker you will have access to them. All courses not previously released will be available for you to edit by the early morning on September 27. Mapping can still be done after the courses are released, but extra time and steps are involved because the courses must be removed from the Learning Environment, mapped, and then released again-which can take up to 24 hours before you again have access.

If you do not want a course mapped, but would like access to it before September 27, just let us know by email. We do not map courses unless requested by the instructor.

If you need course materials from a previous semester copied to a 2017SP course, please let Anne or me know. It generally only takes a few minutes to do this.

It is very helpful and more efficient for us if you specify your courses by Department, Course Number, and Section Number when contacting us for either mapping or copying. For example: "Copy SPED 431 B601 from Spring 2016 into my SPED 431 B603."

Geek Speak! Banned Books and Their Authors

Join us on Thursday at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110 for this week's Geek Speak: Dangerous Minds: Banned Books and their Authors, a panel discussion with Scott Ahola, Emily Eggebraaten, Amber Wilde, and Shana Monnens At the heart of the censorship debate are two questions: What material is or is not appropriate for adolescent readers, and who has the authority to determine what is or is not appropriate? The American Library Association (ALA) defines a challenge as a "formal, written complaint, filed with a library or school requesting the material be removed because of content or appropriateness."

Book challenges are a frequent occurrence in America, with the ALA reporting more than 5,099 recorded challenges between 2000 and 2009. Research suggests that this number is approximately 15% of the actual number of challenges across the nation as so many go unreported or unrecorded. Challengers are most frequently parents of school-aged children, but historically have also been school administrators, school board members, community members, and teachers themselves, and motives range from family values to political views to religion. In recognition of Banned Books Month, please join our experts for a panel discussion on the history of censorship and intellectual freedom and an overview of their most favorite "dangerous" texts. These lectures are free and open to the public.

Research suggests that this number is approximately 15% of the actual number of challenges across the nation as so many go unreported or unrecorded. Challengers are most frequently parents of school-aged children, but historically have also been school administrators, school board members, community members, and teachers themselves, and motives range from family values to political views to religion. In recognition of Banned Books Month, please join our experts for a panel discussion on the history of censorship and intellectual freedom and an overview of their most favorite "dangerous" texts. These lectures are free and open to the public.

We are just beginning to appreciate the essays Benjamin left behind, especially his critique of art reproduction. How does an audio recording of a concert change our experience of that musical event? The mass reproduction of images and sounds, first mechanically and of late digitally, has transformed art for the human, said Benjamin. This talk is a spectacle intended to illustrate and experiment with those transformations on a well-known and widely reproduced image, Leonardo's Mona Lisa. Be prepared for a visual onslaught of just under one thousand Monas, x-rayed, enshrined, snapshot, dissed, defrocked, morphed, mashed, enclocked and coffee-cupped, enquilted and jellybeaned. Geek Speak! Lawyers, Home Runs, and Money: The Long and Ongoing Corruption of Professional Baseball, America's Past-its-Time

Please join us on Thursday, October 27, at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110 for this week's Geek Speak: "Lawyers, Home Runs, and Money: The Long and Ongoing Corruption of Professional Baseball, America's Past-its-Time," hosted by Dr. David Cremean

This talk will open with a "Song of Innocence" briefly involving the personal touch of Dr. Cremean's own youth that featured baseball as his first love and Pete Rose as his first hero before moving to examples that include early professional baseball scandals typically noted and unnoted, ranging from 1919's "Black Sox Scandal" to the long-time money dominance of the New York Yankees and Walter O'Malley's move from Brooklyn to Los Angeles and the scandalous color line to a few more. It will transition into "Songs of Experience" as an examination first of the Mythical function of baseball in works like The Glory of Their Times and Boys of Summer(with Jackie Robinson and Pee Wee Reese as particularly true "heroic" examples), mirroring the nation's move into the 1960s/1970s and on into a more nefarious unfortunate fall emblemized by Pete Rose's gambling scandal, labor strikes, and steroids from the late-1970s to the present.

State Employee Health Plan will Maintain Open Network

From the Commissioner of the BHR:

I am pleased to announce that the South Dakota State Employee Health Plan has agreed to terms with Sanford Health to maintain in-network access for its members to all current physicians and services

This means that, despite Sanford's announcement that it would withdraw from the DAKOTACARE network as of January 1, 2017, state employees will continue to have innetwork access to all current physicians and services after that date.

Sanford Health's announcement required new negotiations to ensure continuity of services for state health plan members. A three-year contract has been signed.

The state health plan is a self-insured plan, meaning we pay our own claims, and can contract directly with health systems. DAKOTACARE remains the state health plan's third-party administrator, which processes claims and assists with customer service for members.

As plan members, you should not notice any changes. Your health plan ID cards will remain valid. All current facilities and physicians, including Avera, Rapid City Regional, Sanford, and many other providers around the state, will continue to provide services at the in-network rate for state health plan members.

Student to Master: Donald F. Montileaux Exhibition

The Ruddell Gallery will be hosting an opening reception to celebrate the work of Lakota artist Donald F. Montileaux, in his Exhibition titled Student to Master. The exhibition will run through the month of November, in conjunction with National American Indian Heritage Month.

Montileaux will be giving an informal gallery talk during the opening reception on Wednesday, November 9th. Reception will begin at 4pm, with the gallery talk tentatively scheduled for 5pm. Below is a brief statement about the exhibition and the artist.

Donald F. Montileaux | Student to Master

November 7 - December 16 Reception: November 9, 4-6pm

Donald F. Montileaux (Yellowbird) is a modern-day storyteller, rekindling the images of the Lakota lifestyle by painting the people as they were. Montileaux regards himself as having a mission: "To portray the Lakota, the Native Americans, in an honest way. To illustrate them as people who hunted buffalo, made love, raised children, cooked meals, and lived. To describe Montileaux's work is to reflect back to his forefathers. The surfaces that they used to make images were hides, rock walls and surfaces both smooth and rough, hides both tanned and rawhide. Montileaux uses modern materials, ledger and watercolor papers as well as canvas and animal hides to create his artwork. While utilizing different types of materials to produce and present the finished product to the viewer, Montileaux achieves slightly the same appearance as his forefathers did to create their work.

A world-renowned artist and illustrator, Montileaux is an enrolled member of the Oglala Lakota Tribe. He has received various awards, including induction into the South Dakota Hall of Fame in 2014. Along with attending major art exhibitions throughout his artistic career, Montileaux's art has illustrated the covers of numerous books. His artworks are included in numerous corporate, public and private collections, and he has been featured in galleries across the nation, including: New Mexico, Minnesota, Arizona, Colorado, and South Dakota. --Submitted by Michael Baum on 2016-11-01

Geek Speak Cancelled for Thurs. Nov. 10 but will continue Nov. 17
Friends, this week's Geek Speak has been cancelled, but please join us on Thursday,
November 17 for Dr. Nag's lecture: "Supersymmetry, Superstrings and the quest for the
Theory Of Everything."

Two of the most successful physical theories describing the nature of objective reality, developed in the 20th Century, are Quantum Mechanics (QM) and Theory of Relativity (TR) (Special Theory of Relativity (STR) and General Theory of Relativity (GTR)). QM deals with subatomic particles while GTR deals with massive objects like planets, stars, galaxy etc. The merger of QM or Quantum Field Theory (QFT) (we can think of as a generalized version of QM) with STR was a successful event leading to relativistic quantum field theory, however the integration of GTR with QFT has become a much more challenging problem to solve. The pathway of the solution to this problem has been constructed using the Superstring theory. Supersymmetry (SUSY) which forms the "Super" part of the Superstring Theory was developed to solve the so called hierarchy problem which occurs in the Standard Model (SM) (describing the three fundamental forces of nature which are Electromagnetic, Weak nuclear and Strong nuclear), which are essentially processes that occur at vastly different energy scales. However, a byproduct of SUSY is a vast new array of "super" particles which may help explain the existence of dark matter. String theory on the other hand with combined with SUSY attempts to solve the problem of the merger of GTR with QFT and in the course of doing that explains the existence of dark matter and dark energy in the Universe. In this talk, I will discuss Superstring theory and its attempt to construct the so called Theory of Everything which essentially combines all the four fundamental forces of nature (Electromagnetic, Weak nuclear, Strong nuclear and Gravity). Along with this spectacular attempt with the merger of QFT and GTR, I will also discuss briefly the development of an elegant geometric description of nature which may be the ultimate tribute to Plato's vision of the Universe.

Geek Speak: The Quest for the Theory of Everything

Join us on Thursday, November 17 at 4:00 p.m. for this week's Geek Speak, hosted by Dr. Nag: "Supersymmetry, Superstrings and the Quest for the Theory Of Everything."

Two of the most successful physical theories describing the nature of objective reality, developed in the 20th Century, are Quantum Mechanics (QM) and Theory of Relativity (TR) (Special Theory of Relativity (STR) and General Theory of Relativity (GTR)). QM deals with subatomic particles while GTR deals with massive objects like planets, stars, galaxy etc. The merger of QM or Quantum Field Theory (QFT) (we can think of as a generalized version of QM) with STR was a successful event leading to relativistic quantum field theory, however the integration of GTR with QFT has become a much more challenging problem to solve. The pathway of the solution to this problem has been constructed using the Superstring theory. Supersymmetry (SUSY) which forms the "Super" part of the Superstring Theory was developed to solve the so called hierarchy problem which occurs in the Standard Model (SM) (describing the three fundamental forces of nature which are Electromagnetic, Weak nuclear and Strong nuclear), which are essentially processes that occur at vastly different energy scales. However, a byproduct of SUSY is a vast new array of "super" particles which may help explain the existence of dark matter. String theory on the other hand with combined with SUSY attempts to solve the problem of the merger of GTR with QFT and in the course of doing that explains the existence of dark matter and dark energy in the Universe. In this talk, I will discuss Superstring theory and its attempt to construct the so called Theory of Everything which essentially combines all the four fundamental forces of nature (Electromagnetic, Weak

nuclear, Strong nuclear and Gravity). Along with this spectacular attempt with the merger of QFT and GTR, I will also discuss briefly the development of an elegant geometric description of nature which may be the ultimate tribute to Plato's vision of the Universe.

Geek Speak: The Quest for the Theory of Everything

Join us on Thursday, November 17 at 4:00 p.m. for this week's Geek Speak, hosted by Dr. Nag: "Supersymmetry, Superstrings and the Quest for the Theory Of Everything."

Two of the most successful physical theories describing the nature of objective reality, developed in the 20th Century, are Quantum Mechanics (QM) and Theory of Relativity (TR) (Special Theory of Relativity (STR) and General Theory of Relativity (GTR)). QM deals with subatomic particles while GTR deals with massive objects like planets, stars, galaxy etc. The merger of QM or Quantum Field Theory (QFT) (we can think of as a generalized version of QM) with STR was a successful event leading to relativistic quantum field theory, however the integration of GTR with QFT has become a much more challenging problem to solve. The pathway of the solution to this problem has been constructed using the Superstring theory. Supersymmetry (SUSY) which forms the "Super" part of the Superstring Theory was developed to solve the so called hierarchy problem which occurs in the Standard Model (SM) (describing the three fundamental forces of nature which are Electromagnetic, Weak nuclear and Strong nuclear), which are essentially processes that occur at vastly different energy scales. However, a byproduct of SUSY is a vast new array of "super" particles which may help explain the existence of dark matter. String theory on the other hand with combined with SUSY attempts to solve the problem of the merger of GTR with QFT and in the course of doing that explains the existence of dark matter and dark energy in the Universe. In this talk, I will discuss Superstring theory and its attempt to construct the so called Theory of Everything which essentially combines all the four fundamental forces of nature (Electromagnetic, Weak nuclear, Strong nuclear and Gravity). Along with this spectacular attempt with the merger of QFT and GTR, I will also discuss briefly the development of an elegant geometric description of nature which may be the ultimate tribute to Plato's vision of the Universe.





Student Early Access to Spring D2L Courses

A REMINDER REGARDING STUDENTS' EARLY ACCESS TO SPRING COURSES OFFERED USING D2L...

The following is paraphrased from the Academic Affairs Council Agenda Item 5.C. dated April 2, 2014. It was approved.

The AAC has approved a recommendation to allow students to access their courses in Desire2Learn (D2L) 30 days prior the official start date of a semester. This began with the 2014FA term. The 30-day access window for Spring 2017 begins December 10, 2016.

The intention is:

To ensure that students have successfully completed the initial steps needed to get into their D2L courses:

They have their BOR usernames/passwords

Their computers are compliant with the various elements of the courses (plugins, internet connection, etc.)

They can see and access their courses in D2L

To afford students the opportunity to orient themselves to their courses.

To allow students access to course syllabi or other introductory materials:

Textbook requirements

Establish access to publishers' websites (access codes)

Other technology/material needs

It is important to note that this pertains only to materials accessed through D2L.

Instructors should not make any assignments due prior to the first day of the term. The specific purpose for this access is to ease the startup process for students. Once the semester begins, the students can focus on the course itself, and not on resolving technical or procedural issues. Campuses will monitor instructor compliance.

Two factors determine when a student can access a course in D2L:

The start date has been reached

The course has been activated by the instructor

The start dates of courses will automatically be changed in D2L to 30 days prior to the first day of the semester. Instructors control when students actually can access their courses by when they activate them. That being the case, student support service offices (IT, registration, advising, etc.) will direct any student questions about early access to a course to the respective instructor.

Missing Emails?

Due to recent phishing scam successes and an increase in overall spam directly affecting our faculty and staff, additional email protection measures have been implemented. These features include Anti-Fraud Intelligence, Intent Analysis, Link Protection, Typosquatting Protection, and Bulk Email Detection. These changes have decreased our incoming email load by 53%.

The setting that will most affect our faculty and staff is that of Bulk Email. The Bulk Email setting will take action with inbound messages that contain unsubscribe links or unsubscribe instructions in the message body, shopping ads, aggressive sales, social media, magazines and many others that harvest our email addresses from public sites. The vast majority of these emails can be considered personal in nature. The Bulk Email Detection setting alone has drastically decreased the amount of spam messages that reach faculty and staff filling up their inbox with unnecessary and often discarded junk emails.

Student Early Access to Spring D2L Courses

A REMINDER REGARDING STUDENTS' EARLY ACCESS TO SPRING COURSES OFFERED USING D2L...

The following is paraphrased from the Academic Affairs Council Agenda Item 5.C. dated April 2, 2014. It was approved.

The AAC has approved a recommendation to allow students to access their courses in Desire2Learn (D2L) 30 days prior the official start date of a semester. This began with the 2014FA term. The 30-day access window for Spring 2017 begins December 10, 2016.

The intention is:

- 1.To ensure that students have successfully completed the initial steps needed to get into their D2L courses:
 - a. They have their BOR usernames/passwords
 - b. Their computers are compliant with the various elements of the courses (plugins internet connection, etc.)
 - c. They can see and access their courses in D2L
- 2. To afford students the opportunity to orient themselves to their courses.
- 3. To allow students access to course syllabi or other introductory materials:
 - a. Textbook requirements
 - b. Establish access to publishers' websites (access codes)
 - c. Other technology/material needs

It is important to note that this pertains only to materials accessed through D2L.

Instructors should not make any assignments due prior to the first day of the term. The specific purpose for this access is to ease the startup process for students. Once the semester begins, the students can focus on the course itself, and not on resolving technical or procedural issues. Campuses will monitor instructor compliance.

Two factors determine when a student can access a course in D2L:

- 1. The start date has been reached
- 2. The course has been activated by the instructor

The start dates of courses will automatically be changed in D2L to 30 days prior to the first day of the semester. Instructors control when students actually can access their courses by when they activate them. That being the case, student support service offices (IT, registration, advising, etc.) will direct any student questions about early access to a course to the respective instructor.

Missing Emails?

Due to recent phishing scam successes and an increase in overall spam directly affecting our faculty and staff, additional email protection measures have been implemented. These features include Anti-Fraud Intelligence, Intent Analysis, Link Protection, Typosquatting Protection, and Bulk Email Detection. These changes have decreased our incoming email load by 53%.

The setting that will most affect our faculty and staff is that of Bulk Email. The Bulk Email setting will take action with inbound messages that contain unsubscribe links or unsubscribe instructions in the message body, shopping ads, aggressive sales, social media, magazines and many others that harvest our email addresses from public sites. The vast majority of these emails can be considered personal in nature. The Bulk Email Detection setting alone has drastically decreased the amount of spam messages that reach faculty and staff filling up their inbox with unnecessary and often discarded junk emails.
