Second Annual BHSU History Student Conference

The history department will hold its 2nd Annual Capstone History Conference on Wednesday (December 6) in 110 Jonas Hall between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Capstone history students will present a component of their final historiography projects in a public setting and answer questions from the audience.

The history department is pleased to announce that Dr. Julia E. Ault (University of Utah) will provide the keynote lecture (110 Jonas, 11 a.m. - 12 p.m.). Her talk, entitled "Defending God's Creation: Dictatorship, Nature, and Society in East Germany," explores how the Protestant Church became a place for activists to gather and protest against environmental degradation in communist East Germany between 1975 and 1989. She traces the regime's claims to protection and how that failure led to the rise of an independent movement based in the Protestant Church. Dr. Ault also shows how the environment drew support from many segments of East German society, but that the Protestant Church was a crucial supporter of the movement both theologically and structurally. Support from the Church and growing dissatisfaction with pollution contributed to a broader discrediting of communism in East Germany that ultimately ended on November 9, 1989 with the fall of the Berlin Wall.

We will provide food and beverages during the conference proceedings.
