## Emergency Preparedness at BHSU; what you should know

With the beginning of the spring semester now underway, BHSU's Emergency Management team would like to remind you of its emergency response preparedness, capabilities and procedures.

While Everbridge is the primary Campus Alert system utilized by the University, Everbridge is just one piece of the multi-faceted, campus notification system used to provide safety and inclement weather alerts, and notification of events which have the potential to threaten the University's ability to conduct regular activities. The system includes email, voicemail and text alerts as well as web page updates.

### How Everbridge works

Everbridge is an opt-in campus-wide notification system for all faculty, staff and registered students. New students, faculty and staff members are contacted by email approx. 3 weeks after the start of the semester (or at the start of employment) requesting them to sign up for the Campus Alert System. For those who missed the initial email sign-up request or would like to update their contact information, please visit BHSU's website and go to "Campus Alert System" for instructions. Additionally, it is recommended that on a yearly basis all users [review their contact information](#), update if necessary, and add additional contact information. The Everbridge system can store and contact multiple cell phones and e-mail addresses per user.

At the same time text, voice and e-mail messages are being delivered, campus alerts will appear on the campus website at the top of the page and also social media sites including [Facebook](#) and [Twitter](#) pages.

BHSU is committed to offering services, information, resources and tools to offer a safe campus to all students, staff, faculty, and visitors. For more information regarding BHSU's safety and emergency practices, visit the [campus Public Safety website](#).

## How do you receive your mail and packages?

Mail Services is responsible for the distribution of mail received from the United States Postal Service (USPS) for all on-campus and international students, faculty, staff and departments. Students receiving packages via USPS, UPS or other ground couriers will be sent a notice when the package arrives and is ready for pick up at the mail services window. All mail for students will be placed in the appropriate mailboxes as quickly as time and amount of mail allows.

Central Receiving is responsible for receiving, processing, and inspecting all packages (UPS, FedEx, DHL, etc) for all faculty, staff and BHSU departments. Central Receiving provides delivery services for goods ordered and purchased by the university's faculty, staff and departments. As such, personal purchases by faculty and staff should not be shipped to the university as an alternative to an individual's home address.

### **Geek Speak: Berlin NOW**

Please join us at 4:00 p.m. on Wednesday, January 31 at the Jacket Zone or Thursday, February 1 in Jonas 110, for Dr. Adam Blackler's "Berlin Now: A Portrait of a City after the Wall"

Since the turn of the millennium, Berlin has been one of the most popular cities in the world. Why, however, is an elusive question. One can find delicious cuisine in each of Berlin's various neighborhoods, for instance, but the Hauptstadt nevertheless lacks the culinary reputation of other European capitals. Though Berlin claims a proud architectural and scientific history, the history of the Third Reich casts a wide shadow, darkening even the most innocuous building and public park. It also boasts no famous architectural monument on the same scale as the Arc de Triomphe, Roman Forum, or Greek Parthenon. Berlin's most iconic monument, in fact, is what little remains of a twelve-foot high concrete wall that once separated East from West.

What attracts so many people to Berlin are precisely those qualities that are missing in more picturesque capitals—the vibrant history, the perpetual incompleteness, the weirdness, and the general outlandishness that exemplify Berlin now. Few places have experienced the extreme transformations that Berlin has undertaken over the past century. The destruction of the old cityscape in the wake of two dictatorships still marks the architectural and cultural fabric of Berlin. Yet this defect does nothing to detract visitors from falling in love with "the Wall city." This presentation will explore the architectural, cultural, and historical marvels that make Berlin such an iconic place to experience. From its embrace of John F. Kennedy's famous 'jelly-donut speech' to Mustafa's Döner Kebab, Berlin offers something for everyone.
