Faculty, Staff, and Student Accomplishments

Drs. Adam Blackler, Jason Daniels, Mary Caton-Rosser, Scott Clarke, Urla Marcus and Nicholle Dragone are the first to participate in a pilot program at BHSU to re-design high-enrollment, high-impact courses with the goals of increasing student engagement, interactivity, and information retention. These six faculty are the inaugural cohort working to achieve the Course Designer Certification. The faculty teams listed above are participating in workshops, monthly team meetings with instructional designer Christopher Dawes, and plan to complete the redesign of their courses by Spring 2018.

Jerry Rawlings, assistant professor of mass communication, has been juried into an international competition/exhibition titled "The Plastic Camera Show" at the RayKo Photo Center in San Francisco. RayKo's 10th annual juried Plastic Camera Show will include images from around the world created with a plastic toy camera by 89 different artists.

Ten thousand images from the Black Hills National Forest Historical Collection have been uploaded into the Digital Library of South Dakota. Hurray! The digitized images include photographs, documents and other archival materials belonging to the Forest Service and housed at the Case Library at BHSU. The images are available to the public through DLSD (Search DLSD, select Black Hills State University, then Black Hills National Forest or use the direct link). The milestone was reached on Friday, Feb. 24, 2017. The Black Hills National Forest Special Collection is a joint project of the Black Hills National Forest, the Black Hills State University, and Neiman Enterprises.
