

All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

IRS Scam Alert

Scam Alert: a member of the BHSU community was recently the victim of an IRS robocall voicemail scam which advised that the person owed back taxes.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a preloaded debit card, wire transfer or credit card. Victims may be threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting.

Note that the IRS will never:

Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, credit card, gift card or wire transfer. Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if you owe any taxes.

Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.

Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money, here's what you should do:

If you know you owe taxes or think you might owe, call the IRS at 1.800.829.1040. The IRS can help you with a payment issue.

Click <u>here</u> if you know you don't owe taxes.

Based in Washington, Simon Bruty has traveled extensively to work on feature stories as diverse as soccer in Zambia, golfers in Greenland, badminton in Indonesia, and haute couture in Paris.
