We have placed additional AED machines across the campus and want to make sure people are comfortable using them. The sessions will be provided by the Spearfish Ambulance at their facility (715 E. Colorado Blvd). The classes are scheduled for October 18 from 9:00 - 12:00, and October 19 from 1:00 - 4:00.

The session typically takes 2 ½ hours. The cost of the training is \$25. per person and should be covered by your departmental budgets. There is a limit of 20 people per session.
