Each of you will soon receive a United Way pledge form either through campus mail or direct delivery. The United Way of the Northern Hills helps 28 organizations in the Belle Fourche, Deadwood, Lead, Spearfish, and Whitewood communities provide assistance to those in need.

The back of the pledge form lists the local organizations who receive financial support from the United Way.

If you wish to contribute, you have the option of paying directly, being invoiced, using a credit card, or selecting payroll deduction. Payroll deductions will not begin until the January, 2018, payroll. You may designate where you would like your donation to be applied and for \$30 you can provide a child a book a month for a year by including the Imagination Library.

100% of your contribution remains in the Black Hills!

Due to partnerships, a donation can be multiplied many times. For instance, \$1 provides 5 meals to families in need, \$15/month provides a child with a backpack of food each weekend of the school year, and \$50 provides 3 children with new winter coats.

This year's goal for the Northern Hills region is \$175,000. Last year's goal was \$160,000 and we surpassed it. BHSU pledges totaled \$8,832.00 last year. Only 46 of our over 400 employees donated. Hopefully, with your help we can greatly improve our combined contribution and participation!

Geek Speak: The Meaning of Everything

Join us Thursday October 5 at 4 pm in Jonas 110 as Professor Andrey Reznikov presents "The Meaning of Everything:" The Making of the Oxford English Dictionary This year celebrates 160th anniversary of the beginning of what would become OED: a unique undertaking in the field of lexicography. The members of the Philological Society who first discussed the idea of a New English Dictionary in 1857 probably did not realize what they were getting themselves into. They believed the dictionary will be in 4

volumes and about 6,400 pages, and it will be ready in 10 years. They were wrong in all three estimates: the dictionary was ready in 70 years, it was in 10 volumes and had 15, 490 pages. About 2,000 people contributed 5 million quotations to the editorial board; one of the most prolific contributors was American physician, Civil War veteran, Dr. W.C. Minor - who was sending his examples of quotations from a ward in a prison asylum.

All lectures are held in Jonas 110 at 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays and are free and open to the public.
