IRS Scam Alert

Scam Alert: a member of the BHSU community was recently the victim of an IRS robocall voicemail scam which advised that the person owed back taxes.

Victims are told they owe money to the IRS and it must be paid promptly through a preloaded debit card, wire transfer or credit card. Victims may be threatened with arrest, deportation or suspension of a business or driver's license. In many cases, the caller becomes hostile and insulting.

Note that the IRS will never:

Call to demand immediate payment using a specific payment method such as a prepaid debit card, credit card, gift card or wire transfer. Generally, the IRS will first mail you a bill if you owe any taxes.

Threaten to immediately bring in local police or other law-enforcement groups to have you arrested for not paying.

Demand that you pay taxes without giving you the opportunity to question or appeal the amount they say you owe.

Ask for credit or debit card numbers over the phone.

If you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money, here's what you should do:

If you know you owe taxes or think you might owe, call the IRS at 1.800.829.1040. The IRS can help you with a payment issue.



BHSU-Rapid City to offer block scheduling option in spring 2018; students complete class in 18 day blocks

This spring, Black Hills State University-Rapid City will become the first South Dakota university to offer this type of block scheduling. Seven block courses will be offered during the 2018 spring semester. Each class will run for 18 consecutive business days, taking place from either 9 a.m.-12 p.m. or 1-4 p.m. each day for the entire block. A scholarship is available for students taking the new block course and will provide \$100 per block for up to \$400 per semester. The University will continue offering daytime and evening classes in the traditional semester-long format, along with the new block schedule option.



Severe Weather Awareness Week

April 24-28, 2017 has been designated Severe Weather Awareness Week in South Dakota. With the approach of warmer weather, it is important to remind BHSU Faculty, Staff and Students to take a moment to review our emergency procedures for severe weather.

In the event of developing weather conditions that could potentially spawn severe weather, the National Weather Service will issue either a Severe Thunderstorm Watch or a Tornado Watch. A Watch means that atmospheric conditions exist for severe weather to develop.

If the National Weather Service upgrades a Watch to a Warning, it means that severe storm conditions exist and that you should take shelter immediately.

Severe weather advisories will be broadcast on local radio and television stations. If you hear that a Severe Weather Watch has been issued for your general area, you should stay alert to weather conditions and be ready to seek shelter. If a Tornado Warning is issued civil defense sirens will be sounded in a non-broken continuous tone that will last up to 3-minutes in duration.

At the sounding of a Severe Weather Warning, take cover in a basement or interior room of your home. If you live in a mobile home, leave at once and seek another shelter. If you are located in a public building go to a lower interior area of the building. Use stairways and avoid the use of elevators. If you are outdoors, seek shelter in a ditch or low area on the ground. Avoid positioning yourself near trees, power lines and telephone poles. If you are in a motor vehicle do not attempt to outrun the tornado, stop, exit the vehicle immediately and seek shelter away from your vehicle. For campus emergency shelter locations, see the information below.

Tornadoes are rare in this area but can and do happen here. We all need to be alert to the weather conditions, act quickly when a tornado is detected, and remain calm. You and your family should know in advance what to do if the civil defense warnings are issued. --Submitted by Phil Pesheck on 2017-04-24

Geek Speak: Madness in Popular Culture: The "Insanity" of Women

Hear from Dr. Laura Colmenero-Chilberg:

Throughout history women have been diagnosed, treated, committed to institutions (or burned at the stake) for symptoms of what their society identified as insanity. From the wild bacchanalia of the Maenads in Ancient Greece, to the delicate insanity of Ophelia, to the mad heroines of classic Victorian literature, to contemporary images found in television series like *Penny Dreadful* and movies like *Kill Bill*, women suffering from mental instability has been a favorite topic of popular culture. Why? Is there really a tie between gender and insanity, a "female malady," or is there something else going on? The social construct of women as "deviant" has a long history. It can be seen in the world's major religions and spiritual traditions, which often view women as "uncontrollable." In the last two centuries in particular, we have seen a very strong connection between the concept of femininity and the cultural construction of madness. In this course we will focus on the historical and cultural factors and behaviors that have been associated with madness in women as it is reflected in popular culture. By examining the representations of insanity in popular culture, we can examine changing ideas about gender, social class and family structures, and the effect these factors have on what we consider to be "sane".



Geek Speak: The Dialectical Cowboy

Geek Speak 2017 kicks off on Thursday with Dr. Steckline's "Mammas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up to Be Oscar Wilde: The Dialectical Cowboy." Join us at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110!

In 1882 Oscar Wilde made a tour of the American West bringing "aesthetic revival" to crowds in a string of Rocky Mountain mining camps, cow camps and train stops. He was not warmly greeted. The emergence of the cowboy myth around this same time reflects the reaction of American males to the sort of decadence Wilde exemplified. From Owen Wister and Teddy Roosevelt and Buffalo Bill onwards, cowboys represent a figure of ambivalence toward civilization and its costs. In the century to follow a dialectical progression of cowboy types evolves out of this conflicted response to *decadence* (or over-civilization), on the one hand, and to its countervailing corrective *atavism* (or regression from civilization) on the other. My tracing of this dialectic identifies five "cowboys" that popular culture has drawn upon for the depiction of saddle tramps, and draws illustrations from not only Wister and Wilde, but additionally John Wayne, *Lonesome Dove*, cowboy trail songs, Wild West Shows, Willie Nelson and Waylon Jennings, the Village People, Kid Rock, Ennis and Jack of *Brokeback Mountain*, Montgomery Clift, Tom McGuane, Ween, and a passel of others. Slap leather and come jaw for a while, pilgrims, and when we get back to the ranch there's gonna be a cool diagram too.

Scam Alert - BHSU

Someone claiming to be from a large multi-national company recently contacted a SDSM&T student encouraging the student to apply for a job. The student then posted his resume to Ziprecruiter.com, which is a reputable site. The multi-national company is real and reputable.

Here is an account of what happened, can you spot the warning signs?

1. Student was contacted about a by a "recruiter" (scammer) who pulled our student's resume from the recruiting web site. The ONLY interview option was an online chat interview. The student asked if there would be a video chat/phone call. It

- wasexplained that "this is the way the world is advancing, so we want to use this method." (first warning sign)
- 2. The scammer used a broad variety of descriptive language, which was copied and pasted from the company's website. The scammer asked for the person's sex (gender), which a US company would not ask in an interview. (second warning sign)
- 3. The scammer mentioned the following job requirements:
 - Must be fluent in communication and English
 - Must be at least 30wpm average
 - Must be 18+
 - Must have a Bank Account (third warning sign)
- 4. The scammer said that the company will be setting up office branches "near your location" and that the student would work from home until the office is set up. (4th warning sign—no specific location)
- 5. The scammer talked about flexible working hours and very high pay for both training (\$17:00 per hour) and hourly work after training (\$25:75 per hour). (5th and 6th warning signs VERY high pay for very low job requirements and incorrect format of currency. It should be \$17.00 and \$25.75)
- 6. The scammer asked "what type of system the student uses—Mac or PC?". The student answered PC, so the scammer stated they require Mac systems thus student will have to get Mac equipment. (7th warning sign required to purchase something before proceeding)
- 7. The scammerthen attempted to obtain the student's SSN and bank account: "The company will provide you a free Apple Mac Book Pro laptop with a fast internet connection and your W4 form will be coming along with the working materials you need to start working with... the company will be providing you with the funds you will be using to purchase the necessary equipment and software programs." (8th and warning signs a W4 will require your Social Security number, which you should NEVER give to someone who contacts you)
- 8. The scam then goes for your bank information: "Once you received the check you are needed to have it deposited to your bank account, Then the funds will be will be credited and available in your account for cash out the next day. (9th and 10thwarning signs Funds from a check are rarely available that quickly AND strangers should not be given your bank account number)

Please DO NOT get caught up in this type of scam, and it can happen with ANY company and ANY resume posting site at ANY time. We have reported this to the FBI and we contacted the company in question, which confirmed it is a scam.

Fortunately, this student figured out it was a scam and did not lose his money. He reported the incident to School of Mines authorities and the FBI is now involved. We ask you to always be vigilant and to report any suspicious activities to law enforcement or our Department of Public Safety.

Geek Speak, "Mammas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up to Be Oscar Wilde: The Dialectical Cowboy," hosted by Dr. Tim Steckline.

Please join us on Thursday, January 12, at 4:00 p.m. in Jonas 110 for this week's Geek Speak, "Mammas Don't Let Your Babies Grow Up to Be Oscar Wilde: The Dialectical Cowboy," hosted by Dr. Tim Steckline. These lectures are free and open to the public.

In 1882 Oscar Wilde made a tour of the American West bringing "aesthetic revival" to crowds in a string of Rocky Mountain mining camps, cow camps and train stops. He was not warmly greeted. The emergence of the cowboy myth around this same time reflects the reaction of American males to the sort of decadence Wilde exemplified. From Owen Wister and Teddy Roosevelt and Buffalo Bill onwards, cowboys represent a figure of ambivalence toward civilization and its costs. In the century to follow a dialectical progression of cowboy types evolves out of this conflicted response to decadence (or over-civilization), on the one hand, and to its countervailing corrective atavism (or regression from civilization) on the other. My tracing of this dialectic identifies five "cowboys" that popular culture has drawn upon for the depiction of saddle tramps, and draws illustrations from not only Wister and Wilde, but additionally John Wayne, Lonesome Dove, cowboy trail songs, Wild West Shows, Willie Nelson and Waylon Jennings, the Village People, Kid Rock, Ennis and Jack of Brokeback Mountain, Montgomery Clift, Tom McGuane, Ween, and a passel of others. Slap leather and come jaw for awhile, pilgrims, and when we get back to the ranch there's gonna be a cool diagram too.

Geek Speak Panic! At the Meat Department. Food Scares as Moral Panics by Dr. Trenton Ellis

Food is paradoxically a life-giving nutritious necessity and a potential vehicle for death. Whether by allergen, adulteration, contamination, or diet-related disease, food can kill you slowly or perhaps rather abruptly. Normally, these facts are lingering far from our minds as we satisfy our appetites. Occasionally, this normalcy is disrupted by a fleeting moment of collective fear. Collective anxiety over food is the distinguishing characteristic of a food scare. Food scares are periods of time during which a large number of people are all sensitized to potential dangers of a food item. These blips of mass culinary terror are distinguished by their sources, whether from an immediate illness or death (food poisoning) or potential for harm through exposure (e.g. health risks). The risks showcased in a food scare are not translated in a political vacuum. Various competing actors have interests in framing perceived risk of the questioned food. The ultimate goal of the actors frame work is to establish their narrative as the dominant narrative. Thus food scares are also subjective projects, or social constructs. Our shared dietary distress is a manufactured experience.

Through this gustatory Geek Speak, Dr. Trenton Ellis, Assistant Professor of Human Services and Sociology, examines food scares through the concept of moral panic. Dr. Ellis uses the case of the 2012 "Pink Slime" or "lean finely-textured beef" food scare to explore the social construction of food scares, especially how different actors assemble and work to control public perception of the food item embodying a scare. This Geek Speak coincides with Dr. Ellis' personal mission to demonstrate our shared experiences and encourage people to use sociology to play with their food. Whether you're a vegan, pro-GMO, beet enthusiast, or a meat-gobbling, free-ranging, bacon aficionado, this Geek Speak should satisfy your hungry mind!

Geek Speak Stunde Null: The Holocaust and Memory after 1945 by Dr. Adam Blackler

National Socialism is a burden for all of us. It does not disappear and in some dark corners you can see that the notion of the Volksgemeinschaft (people's community) still has an appeal. The crimes are part of general memory, the question 'how was it possible?' will not fade with the years and any shift to 'normality' is in vain."

Fritz Stern's indictment on the consequences of Nazism remains as true now as it did when he first delivered it at the opening of the Haus der Wannsee-Konferenz in Berlin. The Holocaust is one of the defining tragedies of the twentieth century. Between the years 1939-1945, Nazi Germany orchestrated the murder of nearly twelve million men, women, and children living in Europe and the western expanse of the Soviet Union. Both the crime and its memory have indelibly shaped the lives of those it affected and forever transformed the cultural and political make-up of the European continent. This presentation will discuss how victims, perpetrators, bystanders, and national populations on both sides of the former "Iron Curtain" remember the crimes committed by the Third Reich. I will also show how the Nazis' quest for racial purification and territorial expansion continue to affect our world today overseas and in the United States.

Geek Speak Panic! At the Meat Department. Food Scares as Moral Panics by Dr. Trenton Ellis

Food is paradoxically a life-giving nutritious necessity and a potential vehicle for death. Whether by allergen, adulteration, contamination, or diet-related disease, food can kill you slowly or perhaps rather abruptly. Normally, these facts are lingering far from our minds as we satisfy our appetites. Occasionally, this normalcy is disrupted by a fleeting moment of collective fear. Collective anxiety over food is the distinguishing characteristic of a food scare. Food scares are periods of time during which a large number of people are all sensitized to potential dangers of a food item. These blips of mass culinary terror are distinguished by their sources, whether from an immediate illness or death (food poisoning) or potential for harm through exposure (e.g. health risks). The risks showcased in a food scare are not translated in a political vacuum. Various competing actors have interests in framing perceived risk of the questioned food. The ultimate goal of the actors frame work is to establish their narrative as the dominant narrative. Thus food scares are also subjective projects, or social constructs. Our shared dietary distress is a manufactured experience.

Through this gustatory Geek Speak, Dr. Trenton Ellis, Assistant Professor of Human Services and Sociology, examines food scares through the concept of moral panic. Dr. Ellis uses the case of the 2012 "Pink Slime" or "lean finely-textured beef" food scare to explore the social

construction of food scares, especially how different actors assemble and work to control public perception of the food item embodying a scare. This Geek Speak coincides with Dr. Ellis' personal mission to demonstrate our shared experiences and encourage people to use sociology to play with their food. Whether you're a vegan, pro-GMO, beet enthusiast, or a meat-gobbling, free-ranging, bacon aficionado, this Geek Speak should satisfy your hungry mind!

Geek Speak Stunde Null: The Holocaust and Memory after 1945 by Dr. Adam Blackler National Socialism is a burden for all of us. It does not disappear and in some dark corners you can see that the notion of the Volksgemeinschaft (people's community) still has an appeal. The crimes are part of general memory, the question 'how was it possible?' will not fade with the years and any shift to 'normality' is in vain."

Fritz Stern's indictment on the consequences of Nazism remains as true now as it did when he first delivered it at the opening of the Haus der Wannsee-Konferenz in Berlin. The Holocaust is one of the defining tragedies of the twentieth century. Between the years 1939-1945, Nazi Germany orchestrated the murder of nearly twelve million men, women, and children living in Europe and the western expanse of the Soviet Union. Both the crime and its memory have indelibly shaped the lives of those it affected and forever transformed the cultural and political make-up of the European continent. This presentation will discuss how victims, perpetrators, bystanders, and national populations on both sides of the former "Iron Curtain" remember the crimes committed by the Third Reich. I will also show how the Nazis' quest for racial purification and territorial expansion continue to affect our world today overseas and in the United States.

Whaling and Phishing Scams

Be on the alert for whaling and phishing scams that may make it into your email mailbox. Whaling emails are emails that look like they come from a senior executive or a high-level administrator, often asking for money transfers, login information, account numbers, personally identifiable information, credit card numbers, etc. Since the emails appear to be coming from the executive, they are often using an email address that is outside of the university but using the executive's name. If you have the slightest hint that messages are not legitimate, ask the sender in-person or by another means to accurately identify the legitimacy. When in doubt, throw it out.

Phishing messages are different from whaling messages as they do not appear to come from a senior official within the university or organization. Phishing messages are similar whaling messages in that they attempt to gather your usernames and passwords, personally identifiable information, credit card numbers, banking information, etc. Phishing messages also press urgency, including threats of mailbox deactivation, requirements for upgrades, and even threats of "legal" action. Again, when in doubt, throw it out.

You are also more than welcome to send us an email to let us know that a phishing message made it through. If you would like to notify us of a phishing message you may forward it to BHSUhelpdesk@BHSU.edu so we can review it, block the sender, and notify others. --Submitted by Garrett Stevens on 2017-03-22

Geek Speak: Advocating for the Protection of Native Women Through Theatrical, Spoken Word and Slam Poetry Performances

Today, in the United States, one out three Native women will be raped during her lifetime, 60% of Native women will be assaulted in their lifetimes. . . 67% of violent crimes committed against Native women are committed by non-Natives" (Sliver of a Full Moon). Twenty-three percent of violent crimes against Native women by Native men can be linked to intergenerational trauma resulting from the effects of oppression, including the boarding school system. Because of legal loopholes in federal law, like the Major Crimes Act (1885) and Oliphant v. Suquamish (1978), there were no legal protections for Native women who were victimized physically and/or sexually until the Violence Against Women Act (VAWA) was renewed in 2013. VAWA offers some protections, but some violent crimes are still omitted. Perhaps worse yet, VAWA only offers protection for Native women living on reservation lands within the continental United States. Alaska Native women and Hawaiian women have been omitted from the protections afforded by VAWA. This Geek Speak seeks to explore the way in which Native women (and men) in the United States are using/used slam poetry, theatrical productions and spoken word videos to advocate for greater legal protections for Native women under VAWA. Specifically, this Geek Speak will address the production of Cherokee playwright Mary Kathryn Nagle's Sliver of a Full Moon, the spoken word video of Ryan Redcorn's poem "To the Indigenous Women," and the performance of Whisper Kish's slam poem "Violence Against Native Women is not Traditional", to open up a discussion about the ways in which Indigenous performances represent Native agency and anti-violence activism in the struggle for the protection of Native women and girls throughout the United States.

To protect your account from hackers: What makes an effective password?

An effective password makes little or no sense to another person. Recommendations are to avoid using actual words, avoid using seasons and years, increase your password length, combine and replace letters with numbers and symbols. As an example, instead of using something like "BlackHills2017" change it to Welov3theBl@ckHills!. Alternatively, take a favorite statement such as "for every choice you make there is a consequence" and use the first letter of each word, and consider swapping some letters for numbers and special characters. Therefore, your password could be "43cym,tiac:(." Be creative and make it more difficult for your account to be hacked. A password using a six-character word can be hacked in fractions of a second. If you go with 10 characters and add in numbers and special characters, the time to break a password is increased by years. Lastly, avoid using the same password on more than one site.

NCUR 2018: Call for Abstracts by University Research Council

NCUR 32 Abstract Guidelines: [Certain Important dates, instructions and links has been highlighted for your convenience]

Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following BHSU link http://www.bhsu.edu/Research/NCUR/Application.aspx is November 10th and the students/mentor will be notified by November 27th.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018 homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.

Abstracts should:

- 1. Clearly state the central research question and/or purpose of the project.
- 2. Provide brief, relevant scholarly or research context (no actual citations required) that demonstrate its attempt to make a unique contribution to the area of inquiry.
- 3. Provide a brief description of the research methodology.
- 4. State conclusions or expected results and the context in which they will be discussed.
- 5. Include text only (no images or graphics)
- 6. Be well-written and well-organized.

Other formatting guidelines:

- 1. References are allowed within abstracts, but not required.
- 2. The form will not process all formatting and special characters (e.g., scientific symbols). Use plain text format for your abstract. There is space in the form to include a link to online documentation, formulas, images, music files, etc. in support of your submission. You may use this space to provide a link to a location to view your abstract in its original form.
- 3. Abstracts are usually 200-300 words long with no paragraph breaks. MAXIMUM LENGTH = 300 WORDS!

Have the following information available when submitting your abstract:

- 1. Name and e-mail address for each faculty mentor and co-author
- 2. Undergraduate Research Office Coordinator (UROC) name, e-mail address, and phone number. If you do not have an UROC then provide the information for whomever is the point of contact at your institution
- 3. Presentation type: oral, poster, visual arts, or performing arts
- 4. Field of study (See below for the complete list.)

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.



Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following BHSU link http://www.bhsu.edu/Research/NCUR/Application.aspx is November 10th and the students/mentor will be notified by November 27th.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018

homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.

Abstracts should:

- 1. Clearly state the central research question and/or purpose of the project.
- 2. Provide brief, relevant scholarly or research context (no actual citations required) that demonstrate its attempt to make a unique contribution to the area of inquiry.
- 3. Provide a brief description of the research methodology.
- 4. State conclusions or expected results and the context in which they will be discussed.
- 5. Include text only (no images or graphics)
- 6. Be well-written and well-organized.

Other formatting guidelines:

- 1. References are allowed within abstracts, but not required.
- 2. The form will not process all formatting and special characters (e.g., scientific symbols). Use plain text format for your abstract. There is space in the form to include a link to online documentation, formulas, images, music files, etc. in support of your submission. You may use this space to provide a link to a location to view your abstract in its original form.
- 3. Abstracts are usually 200-300 words long with no paragraph breaks. MAXIMUM LENGTH = 300 WORDS!

Have the following information available when submitting your abstract:

- 1. Name and e-mail address for each faculty mentor and co-author
- 2. Undergraduate Research Office Coordinator (UROC) name, e-mail address, and phone number. If you do not have an UROC then provide the information for whomever is the point of contact at your institution
- 3. Presentation type: oral, poster, visual arts, or performing arts
- 4. Field of study (See below for the complete list.)

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.

Geek Speak: "Use of Images for Visualization and Visual Literacy in Language Class"

Join us today Thursday, October 19 at 4 pm in Jonas 110 as Dr. Du-Lu Hsiao presents "Use of Images for Visualization and Visual Literacy in Language Class"

In spite of images – as visual aids – have always played an important (if subservient) role in language teaching materials, in our context, Spanish as a Foreign Language (SFL) is a psycholinguistic, social and cultural activity that presents an evident dominance of written input over visual input (Goldstein, 2012). This Geek Speak is just an attempt to show an alternative path that aspires to offer a number of different ways to use images that would help to balance the presence of visual input in the SFL class.

The images have been selected for SFL classes, not because of being design-products for commercial purposes, but because it contains universal visual value and therefore a highly communicative impact. Images, as well as music, can transcend the boundaries of language systems as it allows an interpretation and understanding beyond the specific linguistic coding of languages. By behaving as signs or symbols easily interpreted in the manner of a text, visual content has been treated from two points of view always valid in

the encouragement and development of these socio-emotional strategies that conduct to the development of oral expression and interaction, particularly in the SFL and generally in Foreign Language classroom. These perspectives are specified in procedures of visualization and visual literacy. All lectures are held in Jonas 110 at 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays and are free and open to the public.



NCUR 32 Abstract Guidelines:

Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following BHSU link http://www.bhsu.edu/Research/NCUR/Application.aspx is November 10th and the students/mentor will be notified by November 27th.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018 homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.

Abstracts should:

- 1. Clearly state the central research question and/or purpose of the project.
- 2. Provide brief, relevant scholarly or research context (no actual citations required) that demonstrate its attempt to make a unique contribution to the area of inquiry.

- 3. Provide a brief description of the research methodology.
- 4. State conclusions or expected results and the context in which they will be discussed.
- 5. Include text only (no images or graphics)
- 6. Be well-written and well-organized.

Other formatting guidelines:

- 1. References are allowed within abstracts, but not required.
- 2. The form will not process all formatting and special characters (e.g., scientific symbols). Use plain text format for your abstract. There is space in the form to include a link to online documentation, formulas, images, music files, etc. in support of your submission. You may use this space to provide a link to a location to view your abstract in its original form.
- 3. Abstracts are usually 200-300 words long with no paragraph breaks.MAXIMUM LENGTH = 300 WORDS!

Have the following information available when submitting your abstract:

- 1. Name and e-mail address for each faculty mentor and co-author
- 2. Undergraduate Research Office Coordinator (UROC) name, e-mail address, and phone number. If you do not have an UROC then provide the information for whomever is the point of contact at your institution
- 3. Presentation type: oral, poster, visual arts, or performing arts
- 4. Field of study (See below for the complete list.)

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.

NCUR 32 Abstract Guidelines: [Certain Important dates, instructions and links has been highlighted for your convenience]

Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following <u>BHSU link</u> is <u>November 10th</u> and the students/mentor will be notified by November 27th.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018 homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.

Abstracts should:

- 1. Clearly state the central research question and/or purpose of the project.
- 2. Provide brief, relevant scholarly or research context (no actual citations required) that demonstrate its attempt to make a unique contribution to the area of inquiry.
- 3. Provide a brief description of the research methodology.
- 4. State conclusions or expected results and the context in which they will be discussed.
- 5. Include text only (no images or graphics)
- 6. Be well-written and well-organized.

Other formatting guidelines:

- 1. References are allowed within abstracts, but not required.
- 2. The form will not process all formatting and special characters (e.g., scientific symbols). Use plain text format for your abstract. There is space in the form to include a link to online documentation, formulas, images, music files, etc. in support of your submission. You may use this space to provide a link to a location to view your abstract in its original form.
- 3. Abstracts are usually 200-300 words long with no paragraph breaks. MAXIMUM LENGTH = 300 WORDS!

Have the following information available when submitting your abstract:

- 1. Name and e-mail address for each faculty mentor and co-author
- 2. Undergraduate Research Office Coordinator (UROC) name, e-mail address, and phone number. If you do not have an UROC then provide the information for whomever is the point of contact at your institution
- 3. Presentation type: oral, poster, visual arts, or performing arts
- 4. Field of study (See below for the complete list.)

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.


