#### BHSU Teal Ribbon Day: April 11th

The teal ribbon symbolizes sexual violence prevention. The sexual assault statistics in the United States are startling. Every 98 seconds, a person in the U.S. is sexually assaulted with over half of those assaults going unreported to law enforcement. About 44% of victims are under the age of 18, many of whom know their attacker. It's estimated that 1 in 6 women and 1 in 33 men in America will have experienced an attempted or completed rape in their lifetime. Supporters of sexual assault awareness seek to educate people about the resources available to them if an assault occurs as well as information on how to reduce the risk of an attack.

This talk is a chronological exploration of feminism in popular music.
