**-Workshop I, Wed, April 4th | JA 307 | 2 - 4pm**

Dr. Arnold will share how positive group dynamics stimulate interaction and learning and will guide participants through diverse practical applications for fostering positive learning communities within their classrooms. We will see diverse practical applications for working with the group dynamics in our classrooms.

**-Workshop II, Thurs, April 5th | JA 307 | 2 - 4pm**

This workshop will examine how individual factors, such as motivation, self-esteem and autonomy can have a significant influence on learning and how attention to these factors can provide meaning and incentive for learners.
