On-Campus Employment Opportunity for South Dakota Residents

Students wishing to work on-campus and who have an interest and aptitude in computer software or hardware are invited to apply for a Student Technology Fellow (STF) position. STFs assist faculty with technology in their course delivery through supporting web pages and online courses, video editing, and creating tutorials. Other STFs work with Computer and Network Services supporting computer hardware, software, and networks.

You must maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0 to be eligible. 18 positions are funded and training is provided. The normal work week is 11 hours. Experience with Microsoft and Adobe products is desirable. An STF is eligible to work a maximum of 8 semesters.
