Study Abroad in Germany!

Dr. Bobbi Looney will be leading a short-term trip to Germany May 7-20, 2018 in collaboration with our German partner university, Aalen University.

The 10 days study tour to Germany is a program designed for students interested in intercultural experience. Students will gain valuable knowledge and competencies in foundational areas of business and industry in Germany, develop and understanding of the international dimension to business and industrial globalization, and develop enhanced sensibility to other cultures. The program is intended to be interdisciplinary in nature and emphasizes the development of cultural, economic and industrial understanding of international environments. The 10-day in-country experience further enhances students' international understanding and capability whereby involving students in discussions as well as tours with various multinational businesses. It also provides opportunities to visit touristic and historic sites in Germany (Stuttgart, Munich, Lake Constance, Rhine River, Berlin, Heidelberg, etc).

NCUR 32 Abstract Guidelines: [Certain Important dates, instructions and links has been highlighted for your convenience]

Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following BHSU link <http://www.bhsu.edu/Research/NCUR/Application.aspx> is **November 10th** and the students/mentor will be notified by **November 27th**.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018 homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.

Join us if you dare, on Thursday, October 26 at 4 pm in Jonas 110 as Dr. Courtney Huse Wika presents "Something Wicked This Way Comes: The History, Myths, and Rituals of Halloween"

Straddling the crossroads of light and darkness, autumn and winter, life and death, All Hallows' Eve is rooted in the ancient Celtic celebration of Samhain. November 1 marked a new year for the Celts, and the night before was one of magic and mystery where the veil between worlds was lifted and the night became a conduit for spirits of the dead to revisit the earth. The holiday was both a celebration

of the year's harvest and acknowledgement of the cold, dark months to come. Many of our contemporary practices are rooted in Samhain rituals, such as our costumes, bonfires, tricks and mischief, and door-to-door feasts. This lecture will investigate connections between the ancient holiday and contemporary American traditions, as well as introduce audience members to various Halloween rituals and divination practices of Ireland, Scotland, Wales, and Northern England. Festivities will conclude with a costume contest...so come dressed in your best effort to escape the icy grasps of those who have returned.
