Campaign aims to eliminate sexual violence

This Saturday kicks-off the BHSU Not Here Not Anywhere, sexual violence awareness and prevention campaign. Teal-color awareness ribbons will adorn fans, players, and coaches at the day's football and volleyball games signifying a unified stance against sexual violence and support for victims. The kick-off also includes a special half-time presidential presentation.

The Not Here Not Anywhere campaign concentrates on the elimination of sexual violence via awareness building and bystander interventions. "There is great interest—national and local—on the topic of sexual violence, and people are eager to learn more about what they can do to prevent it," BHSU Title IX Administrator Michael Isaacson said. "This campaign aims to engage everyone within the campus community — including students, administrators, professors, parents, and community members — to energize action and to help all of us see the roles we can play in eliminating sexual violence."

NCUR 2018 Information

NCUR 32 Abstract Guidelines: [Certain Important dates, instructions and links has been highlighted for your convenience]

Deadline for submission to University Research Council by submitting it via the following [BHSU link](#) is November 10th and the students/mentor will be notified by November 27th.

After the abstracts has been reviewed by URC and possibly a panel after which the students/mentor will be notified. After the notification, then submit the abstract via the link on NCUR 2018 homepage from November 27th- December 5, 2017

All approved abstracts must be submitted online through the link on the NCUR 2018 homepage. The link will be open October 3rd through December 5th . All primary submitters will need to create a new account. Note to students who have submitted to NCUR in previous years: A new NCUR account must be created each year. Information does not carry over from year to year.

Notification of acceptance of the abstract by NCUR will begin around January 23, 2018, and continue through middle of February, 2018.

Should your abstract be accepted, you may register for the conference using the same login information. **Early registration opens on January 23, 2018 through February 22, 2018.**

Abstracts should:

1. Clearly state the central research question and/or purpose of the project.
2. Provide brief, relevant scholarly or research context (no actual citations required) that demonstrate its attempt to make a unique contribution to the area of inquiry.
3. Provide a brief description of the research methodology.
4. State conclusions or expected results and the context in which they will be discussed.
5. Include text only (no images or graphics)
6. Be well-written and well-organized.

Other formatting guidelines:

1. References are allowed within abstracts, but not required.
2. The form will not process all formatting and special characters (e.g., scientific symbols). Use plain text format for your abstract. There is space in the form to include a link to online documentation, formulas, images, music files, etc. in support of your submission. You may use this space to provide a link to a location to view your abstract in its original form.
3. Abstracts are usually 200-300 words long with no paragraph breaks. **MAXIMUM LENGTH = 300 WORDS!**

Have the following information available when submitting your abstract:

1. Name and e-mail address for each faculty mentor and co-author
2. Undergraduate Research Office Coordinator (UROC) name, e-mail address, and phone number. If you do not have an UROC then provide the information for whomever is the point of contact at your institution
3. Presentation type: oral, poster, visual arts, or performing arts
4. Field of study (See below for the complete list.)

Two abstracts per primary author are permitted. There is no limit on the number of abstracts submitted per co-author.

All abstracts will undergo a rigorous evaluation by a panel of faculty reviewers. Abstract reviewers will evaluate submissions based on the criteria listed above and will assess overall merit within the context of the specific academic discipline.

Note: The title and author(s) of your abstract will appear EXACTLY as they are entered in the abstract submission form. Please double check punctuation and spelling before submitting.

Geek Speak: "The Joy of SET: Inroads into Combinatorics and Finite Geometry"

Join us Thursday, August 21 as Dr. Dan May presents: "The Joy of SET: Inroads into Combinatorics and Finite Geometry"

The card game SET is a pattern-matching game which is easy to learn, but surprisingly rich in mathematical content. SET was created by a geneticist, and study of the game has allowed mathematicians to answer questions that were posed before the game was even invented! In this Geek Speak, we will learn to play the game (of course!) and examine some of its interesting mathematical properties. Along the way, SET will allow for a gentle and accessible introduction to the fields of combinatorics and finite geometry. (The title of this talk is borrowed from a 2017 book published by Princeton Press.)

All lectures are held in Jonas 110 at 4:00 p.m. on Thursdays and are free and open to the public.
