COURSE DESCRIPTION

The basic Archery Instructor-Trainer course prepares participants with some background in archery and/or education to train others as Basic Archery Instructors. Following the "See one, do one, teach one" model, it consists of the one-day Basic Archery Instructor Course (Day 1), then additional training on archery, management, and instruction (Day 2), and then planning and leading the Basic Archery Instructor Course (Day 3).

Both courses follow the National Archery in the Schools Program (NASP) criteria and protocol. For more information about NASP, go to https://www.naspschools.org/about/about-nasp.

CLASS FORMAT AND PERSONAL PREPAREDNESS

Check in is 7:45 a.m. on the first day. Course days run from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m.

The class format is classroom lectures integrated with skills practice sessions. Attendance is required at all classes.

Scenarios and practice sessions will take place in both classroom and field house or gym. Bring comfortable, casual clothing.

TRAINING AND RETENTION

Training Requirements for BAIT Candidates.

- Candidate must be at least 18 years old.
- Candidate must be trained by a BAIT Specialist level instructor.
- BAIT course length is approximately 24 hours.
- Candidate must pass the BAI practical and score at least 80% on the exam.

Retention Requirements for BAI Activity:

Teach at least one BAI course every two years, complete a BAIT course, or retake the BAI course.

POLICIES

Cancellations

If you cancel or withdraw from a course:

- Greater than or equal to 30 days prior to the course start date, BHSU will retain a \$5.00 administrative fee. The
 remainder of registration fees collected to date will be refunded.
- Within 30 days of the course start date, registration is non-refundable and non-transferable.
- Once the course begins, no refunds will be awarded. All course registrations are non-transferable.

COLLEGE CREDIT

The BAI course is pre-approved for one semester hour undergraduate (OE 292) or graduate (ED 592) credit through the Black Hills State University for \$40. To sign up for college credit, students complete a one-page registration form and submit cash, check or money order (no credit cards; there's an ATM in the lobby) for \$40 made out to "BHSU" the first day of the course. We also accept cash. BHSU students that wish the credits to appear on their spring transcript and count towards financial aid must register and pay the course registration fee and credit fee by December 15, 2018.
