COURSE DESCRIPTION

The National Archery in the Schools Program is an in-school program that promotes the teaching of international-style archery. The program is a cooperative effort between conservation agencies, state Departments of Education, local school districts and archery enthusiasts. The S.D. Department of Game, Fish and Parks, in cooperation with the S.D. Department of Education, sponsor the program in South Dakota. Thematic units of study are provided to schools adopting the program so the concepts of archery can be taught across the curriculum. Study units available include science, reading, social studies and math. These units have been correlated to match the South Dakota Content Standards at various grade levels. CLASS FORMAT AND PERSONAL PREPARADNESS

Check in is at 8:15 am on the first day of the course. Course days run from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm. The class format is classroom lectures integrated with practice sessions. Practice sessions will take place primarily inside, although we may set up outdoors if the weather is nice. Dress in comfortable, casual clothing appropriate for mild physical activity. Wear comfortable shoes. Lunch is *NOT* provided, and food services is not offered on the holiday weekend, so pack a sack lunch or plan on driving to purchase your lunch. Bring a re-fillable water bottle to maintain adequate hydration during the course. Coffee will be available for a small donation and vending machines are on site.

CERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

Students must attend and successfully complete the 24 hour Basic Archery Instructor Trainer (BAIT) course. To successfully complete the course. Students must demonstrate the ability to model the "11 Steps to Archery Success" as defined by the NASP training manual. The student must also be able to teach this information to Basic Archery Instructor (BAI) candidates. BAIT's must also pass the BAI test with 80% accuracy and an additional BAIT test with 80% accuracy.

RECERTIFICATION REQUIREMENTS

To retain certification, BAIT's must teach a BAI class every year. If not teaching a BAI class each year, BAIT's still retain their BAI status by completing the BAI requirements.
