Spearfish Beginning & Experienced Motorcycle Classes

The South Dakota Safety Council is offering Beginning Motorcycle Classes (BRC) and Experienced Motorcycles Classes (ERC) at Black Hills State University in May, 2016. The courses use the Motorcycle Safety Foundation curriculum. There will be three BRC classes and two ERC classes. The BRC Classes are one evening/night, one weekend, and one day. Two ERC classes will be offered at the beginning and end of May. The cost is \$75.00 plus tax for the Beginning Rider Classes and \$60.00 plus tax for the Experienced Rider Classes. Upon successful completion of the course the student is eligible to have the motorcycle endorsement added to their drivers license. The South Dakota Safety Council provides motorcycles for the BRC classes. The students are responsible for their personnel protective equipment. Additional classes are offered in Rapid City during the spring, summer and fall. Classes are offered in Sturgis during June and July.
