There will be no Geek Speak next week because of Easter Break, so please join us on March 31 for Dr. Dan May's lecture, "God Show Me The Way: Religion and Hip Hop." 4:00 p.m., March 31, in Jonas 110.

Hip hop culture has come to occupy a central role in music, both in the United States and around the world. We will briefly outline the history of hip hop, and then take a closer look at the often-overlooked intersection of rap music and religion. Drawing on the culture of traditions such as the Nation of Islam, the Five-Percent Nation and Christianity, religious imagery and themes have been used in hip hop lyrics for decades.

We will listen to many examples of this, and also discuss how the incorporation of religion into hip hop is as relevant and vibrant today as it has ever been. The scholarship of hip hop has also grown to include a focus on the conversation between rap music and religion, and we will see what prominent scholars have to say about all of this.
