Two BHSU athletic teams are headed to DII championship competitions this week creating a March madness atmosphere on campus and throughout the region. The BHSU women's basketball team made history when they were selected for the University's first-ever Division II national tournament. The team, which finished the season ranked fifth, received an at-large bid to the "big dance." Five track team members qualified for the Indoor Track and Field NCAA Division II indoor national championships.
