CLASSES OFFERED

A 2017 survey by the National Association of Colleges and Employers found that more than 50% of employers are looking at each of the following characteristics in potential employees: problem-solving skills, ability to work in a team, communication skills (written), leadership, strong work ethic, analytical/quantitative skills, communication skills (verbal), initiative, detail-oriented, flexibility/adaptability, technical skills, and interpersonal skills. SPEECH AND DEBATE


ACTIVITIES OFFERED
