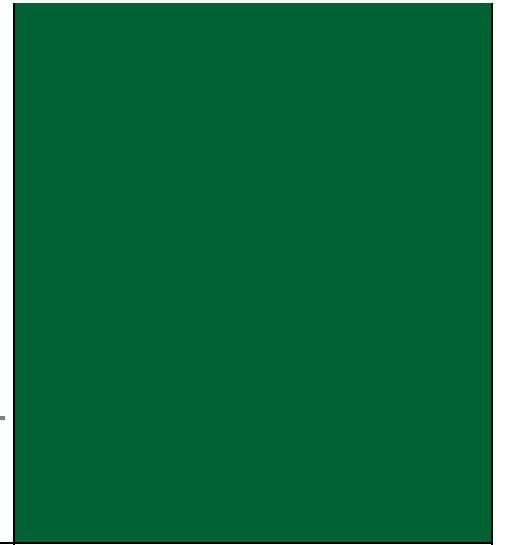

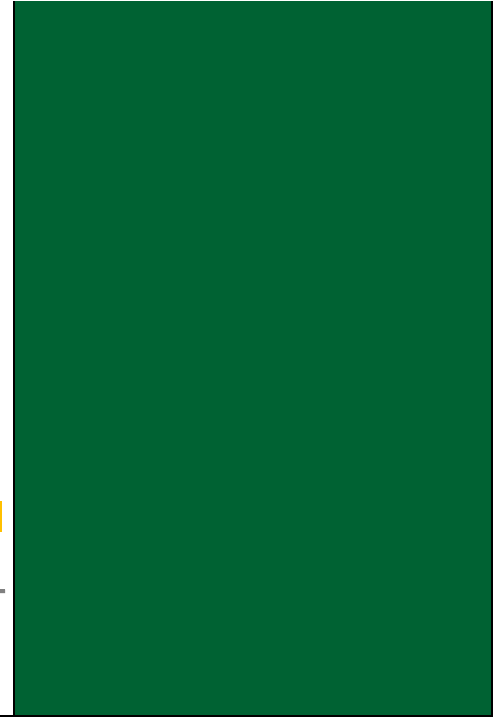

In order to accommodate veterans' families, the Federal Public Housing Authority requested that the College apply for the construction of a trailer camp. Fifteen trailers were purchased from a military base in Alliance, Neb., and installed on the site of the Student Union and the current Jonas Hall. While it was primarily for housing veterans, other students with families were allowed to rent trailers. It in effect

became the first married student housing on campus.

Join us for Dr. Nikki Dragone's Geek Speak: "Speaking on Behalf of the Natural World's Rights" This is a * "BE CURIOUS" event!

On September 13, 2007 the United Nations General Assembly adopted the Declaration on the Rights of Indigenous Peoples. The adoption of this Declaration, together with establishment of three UN bodies dedicated to the recognition and protection of Indigenous rights, represents what Robert A. Williams, Jr. (Lumbee) calls "a measure of the power of [Indigenous] storytelling" through its ability to "raise consciousness," "to give voice to a new vision of the human rights" and, "to redefine the terms of [Indigenous People's] survival in the world." However, Indigenous storytelling in international fora is about more than just Peoples' rights. As a representative of the Cree Nation to the United Nations for nearly three decades, and as a lawyer of Indigenous Rights, Sharon Venne (Cree) has stated that the narratives continuously shared in these fora since 1977 were and are intended to raise the international community's "spiritual consciousness" by giving voice to a vision of the Natural World's rights and redefining not only the terms of their survival, as distinct Peoples, but also redefining the terms of the Natural World's survival. Rather than arguing a specific point of view, this talk seeks to open up the dialogue about the ways in which Indigenous Peoples' relationship with the Natural World forms the foundation of an international movement giving voice to the Natural World's rights through storytelling at international fora.

To open up this dialogue, we will begin by reviewing the history of Indigenous storytelling at these fora and briefly discussing the narrative form and content of the stories being told. This will be followed by an

It is possible to argue, that, slow though it may be, storytelling on behalf of the Natural World and the coming generations through the Indigenous Rights' Movement's fora may already be obtaining recognition for the rights of and redefining the terms of the Natural World, and by extension to the coming generations.

Political commentator Barbara Ehrenreich's 2009 book *Bright-sided* took up the gauntlet in the crusade against optimism after she was exposed to the positive-thinking protocols that accompany cancer treatment these days. She felt infantilized by the onslaught of pink ribbons and teddy bears, and yearned to return to being an adult. This American curse can be traced back to Ralph Waldo Emerson if you will, or perhaps the dual threats of the 1920s, Aimee Semple McPherson and Dale Carnegie. Now *The Secret* can rake in followers via dvd, print, public motivational speakers, or group interaction. Little Orphan Annie promises us that tomorrow is only a day away. Our horrific news reports end with an upbeat invitation to rejoin them when things have gotten even better tomorrow. Politicians build their campaigns around positive thinking, so kindly President Reagan sees morning in America, and Bill Clinton enters stage-right to his theme song, courtesy of Fleetwood Mac, "Don't Stop Thinking about Tomorrow." In the past decade some psychologists have been finding in positive thinking a motive force worth studying as behavioral and material. This critique of the scourge of Optimism will posit that

(a) there is no good reason for positive thinking, and

(b) there are at least four reasons for avoiding this immature practice. As an improvement, Realism will be advocated: setting goals and deploying means and adjusting means to feedback data. Questions will be invited.

Geek Speak: The Origins of Language

Oct. 29 | 4 p.m. | Jonas

Please join us on Thursday at 4 p.m. in Jonas 110 for Dr. Andrey Reznikov's Geek Speak, "The Origins of Language." How did language begin? How did our ancestors create their first words? The main difficulty with trying to answer that question is that there is very little evidence. If paleontologists have fossils, so they can reconstruct the shape of a human skull, oral language leaves no fossils (and writing is a relatively recent invention), so paleo linguists have nothing like that. It does not mean that we should not even try to find an answer (as was the trend in the 19th century), but it does mean that most of our evidence is circumstantial. This lecture will attempt to unravel some of the mysteries behind the origins of language.

New Password Requirements

BHSU constantly works to review and improve the practices, policies, and technology used to secure University resources. As part of this ongoing effort, Network & Computer Services will be applying password expirations and complexity requirements to student email accounts. The new requirements and initial password expiration will take effect at the end of the month, Sept. 30.

If you have not changed your password in the last 90 days, you will need to change your password before the expiration on Sept. 30. Your new password must be 8 characters long, and include at least three different types of characters (uppercase, lowercase, numbers, and/or symbols). You can change your password using the method described on our [FAQ page](#).

Password Security Quick Facts

- How often passwords must be changed: Every 90 days. This is not a set date. The 90 day timer is set when you change your password. Example - Sting changes his password in October. In November, he forgets his password and changes it again. Sting is not required to change his password again until sometime in February—90 days after the November change.
- Complexity requirements:
 - 8 characters long
 - Contain 3 of the following types of characters:
 - Uppercase letter
 - Lowercase letter
 - Number
 - Symbol
 - Examples (do not use any of these):
 - p@s\$w0rd (lowercase, symbol, number)
 - Pa\$\$worD (uppercase, lowercase, symbol)
 - Numb3r3d (uppercase, lowercase, number)

Football Game Tailgate Information

BHSU Yellow Jacket football home opener is Saturday against Colorado School of Mines. The day gets started with the tailgate beginning at 10 a.m. in the Joy Center parking lot. The lot will open at 9:30 a.m. for vehicles to begin filling in the 34 spaces on a first-come, first-serve basis. If you are parked in the Joy Center lot, you are asked to tailgate from the vehicle. If not tailgating from your vehicle, please park in the gravel lot across the street from the stadium, walk across St. Joe Street, and join the Tailgate Tent area at the Joy Center.

Tailgating is prohibited in any parking lot outside of the Joy Center lot or Joy Center Tailgate Tent area. The tailgate runs from 10 a.m. to kickoff, which is noon against Colorado Mines.

A meal deal of a burger or brat, chips, a side dish and beverage can be purchased for \$10. Single beverages can be purchased for \$2 for nonalcoholic and \$3 for adult beverages (must be 21 and wearing ID bracelet).
