

**Black Hills State University, HEERF Student Grant Programs
Report for Q1 2022 (ending March 31, 2022)**

6. The method(s) used by the institution to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under the CRRSAA and ARP (a)(1) and (a)(4) programs.

Disbursements were made to the following undergraduate student groups:

- Pell-eligible
- Not Pell-eligible, but has taken student loans
- Students without federal aid

Spring 2022

- \$625 to Pell-eligible students
- \$400 to students who were not Pell eligible but took student loans
- \$200 to students without federal aid

Once these initial disbursements were made, we had additional funds remaining. We communicated with students informing them of a secondary application where they could request additional funds if they felt we had misidentified their level of need. An additional \$300 was disbursed to students who applied.

7. Any instructions, directions, or guidance provided by the institution to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants.

Students were notified, via email and e-campus update, that funding was available, and an online application had to be submitted to verify eligibility and receive an award. Students that were not awarded received an email indicating why they weren't eligible for the funds.
