
PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE Greetings from Black Hills State University!

The Sanford Underground Research Facility (SURF) is partnering with Black Hills State University (BHSU) to continue the Artist-in-Residence (AiR) program, which was implemented in 2019. Gina Gibson, BHSU professor of graphic communication and SURF's first artist in residence, will serve as the coordinator of the program starting this fall. Artist-in-residence programs are used as a tool to create awareness and encourage interdisciplinary work. The purpose of the SURF AiR program is to invite artists to create work inspired by SURF. SURF's location, legacy and research make it an ideal place for creative work. SURF is the deepest underground laboratory in the United States, reaching a mile below the surface. It houses experiments in physics, biology, geology and engineering. In the summer, a selected artist will immerse themselves in the facility's unique environment

and cutting-edge research, visiting SURF's surface and underground spaces. The artist will then


