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Our Purpose

The South Dakota Board of Regents is offering week-long career exploration camps on campuses for incoming 7th and 8th grade students in Summer 2023. This is a FREE camp thanks to a grant by the South Dakota Department of Education, the South Dakota Board of Technical Education, and the South Dakota Board of Regents!

Campers will be immersed in a week of 'college life' designed to explore career paths through engaging activities and tours of area business and industry. By the end of this fiveday residential camp, students will have a better understanding of themselves, their personal career interests, and how education connects to these professions.
